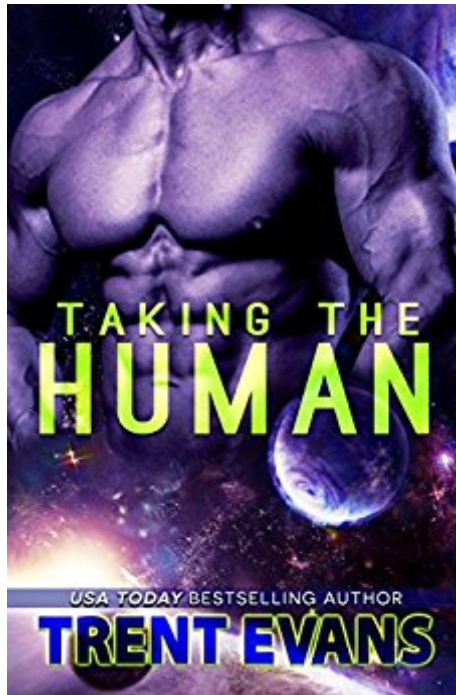




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Taking The Human (Terran Captives Book 1)

Well, I don't often offer my opinions, but I felt compelled by this book. So often in books of this genre a denied orgasm is used as a means of control and punishment. This book was sort of like that. It had a good premise and the characters had potential, but it never really hit pay dirt. The sex scenes were brutal, with no playfulness or joy. There were mentions of impropriety and blatant unlawful activities, but no background on where those cultural beliefs originated. The main characters feelings for each other were described in awkward scenes where he basically assaulted her and she just endured. Her arousal was supposed to be enough to convince us that it was all okay. Sadly disappointing.

This was a very good BDSM story. It truly shows how in this particular world (BDSM) a sub and Dom experience the levels of going passed boundaries, the love a Dom shares with his Sub and how a loving Dom truly takes care of his Sub. While some people might not understand how a woman would want to be totally controlled and dominated, it is a reality. The only difference in this instance is because Allise is more of a slave to her Dom, Lukanos, the alien species that virtually kidnapped her, however, the choice to stay was hers and she knew deep within her this was something she had always wanted. When starting out, it seems that Lukanos is an uncaring, selfish alien man. As

the story progresses you see the bond that develops between them and how falling in love is a very real part of it. A Dom very seldom reveals feelings of love through words but will always try to show her through certain actions. Falling in love does happen between these kind of relationships as it did in this one. This is not a hard core story. It lightly touches the mechanics of a BDSM relationship. Great Story!!!!

This was sadly beyond disappointing and rather than being a dark type romance it was both a depressing and appalling piece of porn. The Alisse character was a pitiful example of a woman who seriously needed professional help. How could any woman enjoy the debasement she did with a shred of self-worth. I kept hoping that at some point she would think "enough is enough".this has gone too far." There was no sensible plot to this and the other characters in the story weren't well defined. The Lukanos character couldn't have enjoyed making her suffer like he did if he loved her. I couldn't find anything to like about him. This failed to do that and ended up being a BDSM book in a different outfit.

The idea alone is an embarrassment, yet Lukanos' cannot help himself. His entire career is in jeopardy because he's allowed temptation to overtake him with the alluring human slave, Alisse. He wants her for his own.I thought this paranormal story was well written and well played out. It's not a story that hasn't been told before --- of a powerful man (in this case an 8' alien) --- who is overcome by temptation of the very thing he's supposed to avoid...a human female. Everything about Alisse holds a power over him. From her intelligence and strong will, to her physical beauty and soft curves. Even her fear and her tears attract him. He becomes obsessed with her. And despite his advanced race...despite his superior intelligence,

Lukanos discovers how much he's underestimated the human female. She's more complicated than he ever suspected. But he even likes her complications. They pose a challenge for him. I expected more from this story other than one hedonistic sex scene after another. I expected more defiance from Alisse, instead of compliance. Yes, I know she agreed to be a slave in a D/s situation when she was given the choice of being returned to Earth. She agreed to stay and be a slave in exchange for knowledge (her being a scientist)...even though she'd never be able to share any newfound knowledge she acquires. But it didn't make sense! And for being so intelligent, she doesn't weigh it out intelligently. She never took into consideration the extent of the demands that would be made on her...and I expected her to rebel even though she has no choice but to submit. I expected some adverse reaction to the degrading, humiliating, deviant sex acts committed on her person. This alien being owns her and she gladly gives herself to him in any way he wants. And in the end, he finds that he doesn't own her as much as she owns him. And his emptiness is fulfilled. Explicitly told with a XXX rating.
