Most of this book takes place in Scotland in the years following World War I. I have read very few romances written in this period, so it was a new setting for me, filled with interesting historical tidbits. The heroine Adeline is reckless and undisciplined, yet kind and caring. The hero Edward is understanding but stern, determined to reform Adeline, or at least keep her from endangering herself. Adeline is stubborn and defiant, and somewhat slow to embrace correction, so there are many escalating discipline scenes in this book, but nothing too severe. The love scenes are detailed and sexy, while still sweet and charming. Edward takes such care with Adeline that the love scenes are a definite highlight in the book. All in all, I really enjoyed it.
