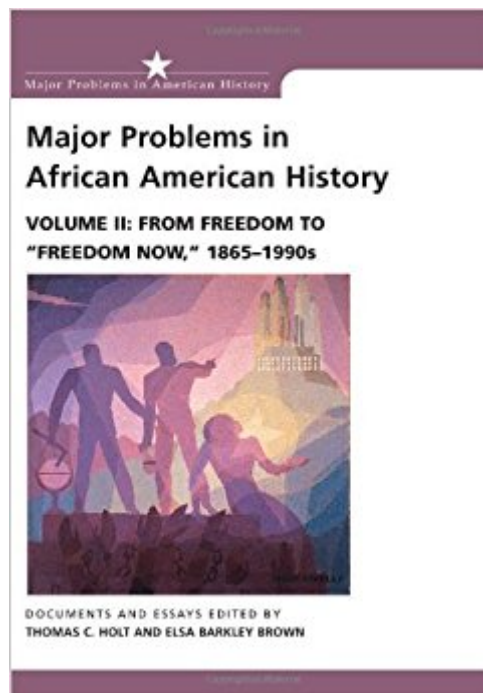




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Major Problems In African American History, Vol. 2: From Freedom To Freedom Now, 1865-1990s
