

Ã¢â€œbranchÃ¢â€), and wrote this childrenÃ¢â€s story, AnnaÃ¢â€s Prayer Ã¢â€ the story of his immigrant ancestors. Anna lived with her mother and sister in Sweden. When they joined the Mormon church, they were persecuted and her mother was fired. Her mother ultimately decided to send her and her sister to America. The book tells of AnnaÃ¢â€s journey, first by boat to the United States, then by train to Utah. It tells of her struggles as a young girl alone in America, unable to speak English. Anna remembers, though, what her mama told her Ã¢â€ that her Heavenly Father understands her. God answered her prayer for a Swedish speaker Ã¢â€ and then some! The book, of course, revolves around a Mormon young girl. However, there is nothing in the text that would offend or concern me as a conservative Protestant Christian.
