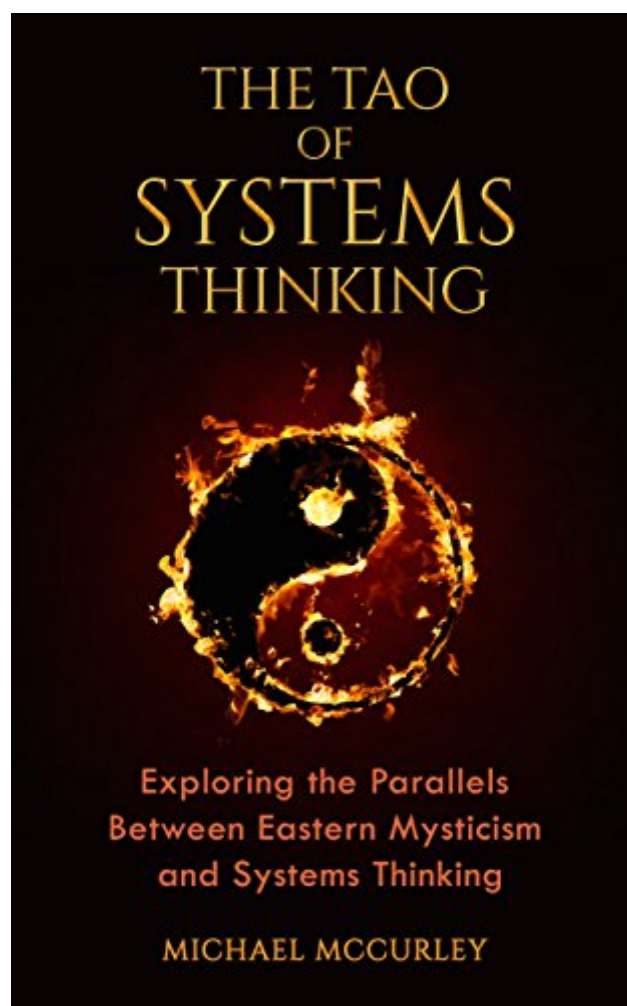

The scope of your book was very grand, touching on philosophical subjects throughout its context, among other things. However, the tone and style of the writing was very natural, smooth, and easy to comprehend. There was never a moment where I felt confused or lost, even when the subjects took on a profound nature.
