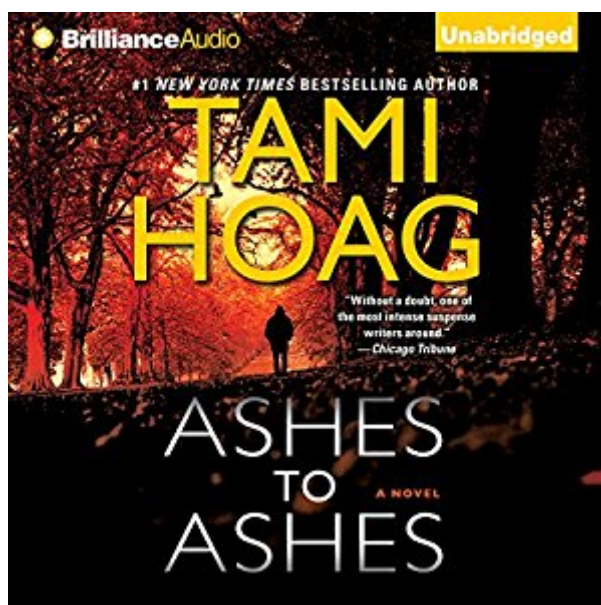


The book was found

This is my first book I have read by Tami Hoagland, and definitely will not be my last. (I have already downloaded 2 other of her books) Anyway, her characters have so much depth you feel as if you could sit down and talk to them. Tami Hoag has the ability to portray real terror from the victims and the real monsters who perpetrate the crimes. Her books will keep you up at night.

Kate is a victim's advocate and Ex-FBI agent. She doesn't do children - at least not until she is specifically assigned a teenager by her boss. She's actually a witness who saw the Cremater, a man who tortures his victims and then sets them on fire. Since the criminal is a serial murderer, Quinn is brought in from the FBI. He's a well known agent, and he and Kate have a history. This was a very good book that fleshes out the characters and brings them to life. The mystery of who the serial killer is goes down a road I did not expect. I will read the next in the series.

I love Tami Hoag. I think my most favorite thing about her is the way she builds her characters to the point the reader actually becomes attached to them and wants more books with them. The crime mystery is thrilling and all of her books are twisty and curvy ride on the edge of your seat. I recommend everyone of her suspense thrillers.
